After a 12-month internship he moved to Indiana where he began working at the Hudson Institute, where he established partnerships with higher education institutions, organising briefings, meetings and performed analyses.

In December 2002, he moved back to Poland where he was hired in the office of Lech Walesa in Gdansk.

In June 2009, he successfully ran for elections to the European Parliament, becoming a member of the Committee on Fisheries, the Vice-Coordinator of the Committee on Petitions, member of the Delegation to the EU- Turkey Joint Parliamentary Committee and deputy member of the International Trade Committee and Delegation for relations with Japan.

In May 2014 he was re-elected to the European Parliament from the Pomeranian Region. He became a Vice-chair of the Committee on Fisheries, again the deputy coordinator of the Committee on Petitions, a Member of the Delegation for Relations with Japan, a Substitute member of the Committee on International Trade, a Delegation for relations with the countries of Central America, a Delegation to the Euro-Latin American Parliamentary Assembly.
